I write to you in relation to your correspondence 2 August and subsequent mischaracterisations that you have failed to receive a reply from In Good Faith Foundation (IGFF) recently published on your website.

As outlined in an email to you on 3 August at 15:13pm, IGFF had every intention of providing responses, where possible, to your extensive 12-point enquiry.

As also stated in that reply, due to Covid-19 restrictions, lockdown and supporting our active client base of over 300 survivors, our usual ability to swiftly reply to complex correspondence has been impacted.

While we apologise for any inconvenience, some delay is unavoidable.

Unfortunately given the attempts to misrepresent IGFF and disparaging claims made about our previous work supporting Survivors on your website, we feel that a constructive dialogue may not be possible in this instance.

IGFF respectfully request that you promptly remove our Copyright protected logo from your website and refrain from making further misrepresentations or false/inaccurate characterisations in future.
